Strong and Effective

- Supporting our Full Time Officers and volunteer Reps to develop the skills they need to be effective representatives and leaders
- Improving our Class Rep system to ensure every substantive class has an identifiable representative
- Developing more representative roles to better reflect the membership e.g. apprentices, part-time students, students with English as a second or other language, care experienced students, etc.

Feedback to Impact

- Develop new and improved systems and processes to gather feedback promptly at a class, subject area, campus or whole College level in order to ensure maximum impact
- Develop new systems for representatives to use to communicate with their peers and gather feedback on key priority issues throughout the year to show the impact of feedback, developing conversations, rather than merely data gathering
- Link key priority issues with College quality priorities in order to support improvements throughout the College student experience, further developing a partnership approach to improvement

Technology and AI

- Make use of all technologies available to us to improve the organisation and the wider student experience
- Develop new digital systems to improve the effectiveness of our services and help support a better student experience
- Ensure we have the knowledge of what technologies are available and they are deployed to support students' learning experience











Culture of Involvement

- Develop processes for students to lead the organisation and delivery of their own activities and events
- Provide opportunities for students to support the delivery of campaigns and awareness-raising activities
- Create reward or recognition schemes for students who participate or lead activities as part of personal development

Volunteering

- Embed volunteering opportunities in the running of our services
- Create a volunteering recognition scheme to showcase and reward the time and commitment of our volunteers
- Work with partners to develop shared volunteering opportunities on campus, and in the community

Building Community

- Creating physical and digital spaces where students are encouraged to take ownership of them and support fellow students to get involved
- Support the development of communities on campuses, by providing bespoke services or activities for each campus
- Ensure our brand is recognisable across the College and synonymous with safe and student-owned spaces

Tackling Poverty

- Continue to address food poverty on campuses through our community fridge programme and the development of new schemes to address the issue
- Work with partners to ensure students are accessing any financial support they are entitled to, either through student funding processes or Social Security Scotland
- Support the development of paid opportunities for students across the College to provide income, experience, and support to as many students as possible

Peer-to-peer

- Engage with curriculum areas to develop opportunities for returning students to support new students within the same academic departments
- Working with partners to develop programmes to support care experienced students through networks and peer-to-peer support
- Develop partnerships with external organisations to give EC students opportunities to develop skills and knowledge to best support fellow students

Upskilling our team

- Develop an annually-reviewed skills matrix for our staff team to identify what skills the organisation needs in order to deliver for students
- Support staff through a continued professional development process to plan and engage in learning to best support the needs of the organisation
- Work with partner organisations to ensure opportunities to make the most of knowledge sharing and gaining accreditations

Working with relevant partners to make our spaces, activities, and events more physically accessible to all students – considering frameworks or accreditations



Improve communications networks to ensure the right information is getting to those less engaged students



Engage with particular demographics of student and learner groups to understand, develop, and implement new opportunities which better fit their needs

Engage with partners representing specific demographics or needs to help improve our understanding of the particular challenges they face



Work with partners to get them onto campuses to engage directly with our members



Develop a network of partner organisations to help signpost our students with specific needs or experiences and create safe spaces on campus and in the community

Develop campus-specific student-led groups to create new programmes of events and activities for each campus



Annually report on the opportunities provided and the engagement on each campus to better understand our impact



Work with local partners geographically relevant to each campus to help build support and opportunities relevant to them









Climate Education

- Develop materials for students to find out more and improve their understanding of the climate crisis
- Create events and activities throughout the academic year to highlight issues related to the climate crisis that are relevant to the lives of Edinburgh College students
- Develop branding and support materials to visually show the link between our activities and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs)

Lead by Example

- Review our activities and create an action plan to improve our organisational sustainability, reporting annually on our progress
- Introduce climate-friendly and/or sustainable products as part of wider events and activities that highlight alternatives to contribute towards carbon reduction
- Track and report annually on steps taken to improve our organisational sustainability from 2025 baselines to 2028 progress

Waste Reduction

- Work towards reducing single-use plastics in everything that we do, supporting the wider College in creating a plastic-conscious campus
- Engage with the College Biodiversity action plan to support students to participate in schemes such as Hedgehog Friendly Campuses
- Develop the opportunities for students to engage with food redistribution projects, supporting volunteering, delivery, and expansion in new ways









Foundations

We will support the plan by making sure we have the right foundations to build on everything that we do. We will concentrate this on three specific areas:

Communications

- Developing new channels
- Focus on developing opportunities for conversations with students
- Ensuring better awareness of our brand, values, and activities

Partnerships

- Formalising a partnership agreement with the College to clarify our needs and expectations
- Working more closely with providers to help support the specialist areas we need to deliver
- Developing joint projects with key partners, increasing capacity to deliver and source potential new funding to support projects

Income Generation

- Develop increased income generation around our large annual events (e.g. Freshers' Week and Elections)
- Create partnerships to apply for external grant funding for joint, studentfacing projects
- Work with College colleagues to generate on-campus sales
